

Ayouth Month and on May 19 the Worcester County Model A Club led by President Joe Becker and ten members spent the morning with high school students from Bay Path Regional Vocational School Automotive Technology class in Charlton, MA.

Club members brought eight Model A's; a 1930 Fordor Briggs Town Sedan, a 1931 Fordor Murry Sedan, two 1931 Slant Window Sedans, a 1929 Tudor, a 1930 Roadster and a late 1931 Pickup. Students

were able to see how the different body styles were interchangeable on the same frame while using the same drivetrain and motor.

Member Jim Sheridan drove his 1913 Model T for the students to have an opportunity to compare the advances Ford made with the Model A over the Model T. Students learned the history of the A and were actively involved in asking questions. A big applause came when we compared the Model T blub type horn to the famous Model A ahooga horn.







Also on display were a variety of parts including a distributor, coil, sparkplugs, head, piston and connecting rod, carburetor, intake and exhaust manifold, water pump and brake shoe assembly and drum. Students were able to handle the parts and they found the mechanical brakes compared to hydraulic brakes quite interesting.

A short video was shown on a four-cylinder flathead engine running with a transparent cylinder head. A second video; Tesla vs Model T compared the similarities and differences from then to current day automotive technology. Additionally, Ford specification sheets and fun facts on the Model A were distributed







by President Becker. The Model A Mechanics Handbook by Les Andrews was donated by the club for their library.

Overall, the club felt that this was a rewarding day for members and more importantly the students. Over fifty students and teachers partook, and we learned that one student has a 1931 coupe gifted by his grandfather and showed interest in joining the club.
